

45 Minute Drive



Identify the labor pool within a 45-minute drive of Corinth, Mississippi based on information from people who register in the state labor exchange and people who are graduating from high schools, community colleges, universities, and training programs.



Connect Labor Pool to Jobs

Connect people in the labor pool with the employer by posting their job in the state labor exchange, Mississippi Works, and empowering the employer to directly recruit through electronic invitations, Job-Vites.





Skills verification

Ensure that applicants fully meet requirements for the job to close the skill gap based on the employer's requirements for education and skills.

MISSISSIPPI WORKS

Mississippi has created a system like no other state, commonly known as Mississippi Works. Mississippi Works helps to identify the right labor pool at the right time for the right employer, and it directly connects the labor pool realtime with the employer. Those who apply are first referred to a local workforce organization for skill verification and potential additional training. Only applicants who have all requirements specified by the job description are referred to the employer. Mississippi Works has been used successfully by Toyota and other Fortune 500 companies in the state, along with many others. Within the last year alone, 5,147 individuals living within a 45-minute drive of Corinth, Mississippi were registered in the Mississippi Works system and have been actively looking for work. These individuals have the basic requirements for the major occupations in automotive supply manufacturing, such as engineering, computer science, and STEM, construction, installation and maintenance, production, transportation, business, management, and sales, and office support.

NSPARC

One of the key resources for workforce and economic development in the state is the National Strategic Planning and Analysis Research Center (NSPARC) at Mississippi State University. NSPARC provides data analysis and logistics to integrate the strategies of multiple workforce and economic development stakeholders. NSPARC works closely with the Mississippi Community College Board and all 15 community colleges. NSPARC also coordinates activities at the state and local levels as part of the state's implementation of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Reconciliation Act (WIOA). Based on NSPARC estimates, which come from Bureau of Labor Statistics data, there are 44,255 people within a 45-minute drive of Cornith, Mississippi currently employed in automotive supply manufacturing occupations, such as engineering, computer science, and STEM, construction, installation and maintenance, production, transportation, business, management, and sales, and office support.

SLDS

In its effort to align education with workforce needs, the state created the State Longitudinal Data system (SLDS). The SLDS tracks the annual number of graduates that come from specific places, counties and regions in the state, and aligns their educational backgrounds with workforce requirements. Every state in the nation has an SLDS, but Mississippi is considered one of the best systems in the country by the National Workforce Data Quality Campaign (http://www. workforcedqc.org). Based on data from the SLDS, over the last year there were 770 community college graduates and 153 university graduates whose educational backgrounds line up with positions in automotive supply manufacturing, such as engineering, computer science, and STEM, construction, installation and maintenance, production, transportation, business, management, and sales, and office support.

BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS

A focus of workforce development is to develop sustainable partnerships with businesses. In the last decade, Mississippi has invested tremendous resources in establishing partnerships with over 55,000 active businesses in the state. The quality of the relationship with businesses is best described by the following quote:
